#### Ph.D Degree in English Language Curricula and Instruction

##### A. Admission Requirements:

Students wishing to enroll in this program must satisfy the following two conditions:

- Have a bachelor degree in english.
- Have a Master's degree in English language curricula and instruction. Applicants with a Masters' degree in linguistics, English Language and Literature or Translation can be considered for admission provided that they study remedial and/or additional courses as required by the Department
- Meeting the English language requirements as outlined by the decisions of the Higher Education Council.

##### B. Degree Requirements:

1. Meeting the conditions stipulated in the Doctoral program regulations number (4) for the year 2011.
2. Completion of remedial courses recommended by the department graduate studies committee.
3. Studying and successfully passing at least (36) credit hours from the level of (700) and above.
