A. Admission Requirements:

- Have a Master's degree in Measurement and Evaluation. (Other specialties like Educational Psychology, Mathematics, Computer Sciences, Statistics or Mathematics instruction could be considered).
- Meeting the English language requirements as outlined by the decisions of the Higher Education Council.

B. Degree Requirements:

1. Meeting the conditions stipulated in the Doctoral program regulations number (4) for the year 2011.
2. Completion of remedial courses recommended by the department graduate studies committee.
3. Studying and successfully passing at least (36) credit hours from the level of (700) and above.
